
Principle

- mapping out every movement





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
Methods

- Timing and notating of lifting fingers
- Selective Buzzing (associative practice)
- Optical Control (hand-eye coordination)
- Exaggerating difficulty
- Right-hand practice









Only 1st finger pressing down


Movement follows eye

- Identify difficulties
- Simplify
- Gradually increase difficulty until exaggeration




Variation number 5 from Fernando Sor's Variations on a Theme by Mozart, op 9




Identify difficulties:

transversal movement (pull-offs) and longitudinal movement (position change)



Simplify

Take out inhibiting factors



Exaggerate

Gradually increase difficulty beyond original version
